Sixth Form Dress Code – Smart, Professional, Prepared

At The Grange School, our Sixth Form students are an integral part of the wider school community and serve as role models to younger students. As such, we expect all Sixth Formers to maintain a smart, business-like appearance throughout the school day.

While we do not expect formal business suits, casual wear is not appropriate for school. Clothing should be neat, professional, and suitable for a learning environment.

Guidance for Male Students

- A business-style shirt, smart plain t-shirt, or polo shirt (a small logo is acceptable).
- Smart trousers (no jeans or casual trousers).
- Ties are optional.
- Smart business shoes – trainers or canvas shoes are not permitted.
- Optional: A smart jacket, plain cardigan, or V-neck jumper may be worn over the above.

Guidance for Female Students

- Skirts or dresses should sit no more than 3 inches above the knee when walking. Stretchy material is acceptable if the garment remains at an appropriate length. **Mini-skirts, shorts, or skorts are not permitted.**
- Trousers should appear tailored. Cropped trousers are acceptable. **Jeans, leggings, jeggings, and tight-fitting trousers are not allowed.**
- Tops should be business-like. **Revealing strappy or cropped tops are not suitable, even in warm weather.**
- Smart business shoes – no flip-flops, or canvas footwear. **Smart sandals are acceptable, Crocs and Ugg boots/shoes are unacceptable.**
- Optional: A smart jacket, cardigan, or plain jumper may be worn.

BTEC Sport and NVQ Football Students

Students on practical courses must attend school in business dress and change into the appropriate Sixth Form PE kit or Year 11 PE kit for practical lessons only.

Jewellery, Piercings and nails:

Jewellery should be discreet and not impact learning. Acrylic nails are ok but need to be a sensible length to be able to write and complete coursework.

Items That Are Not Permitted

- Casual jackets (e.g., fleeces or sportswear tops)
- Sportswear (except during designated practical lessons)
- Denim (in any form)
- T-shirts, or tops with large logos
